Intent

We believe that students achieve the best in a purposeful and interesting learning environment. Teaching and Learning are of prime importance. The results of our surveys tell us that students' attitudes to education and the promotion of a structured learning environment are vital. School uniform supports the development of a positive approach to learning and differentiates learning time in college from home and the social environment. It also:

- promotes a sense of community identity and helps students to feel a sense of pride in their College. Students transfer from a number of primary schools. It is important that they develop allegiance to Crown Hills and identify with the College ethos.
- It encourages our students to develop habits for life. By learning to polish their shoes, fold • trousers or hang up their blazers, pupils learn the habits of discipline and personal responsibility that will stay with them for life.
- It prevents unkindness or bullying while keeping costs down. By requiring all our pupils to wear the same low-cost uniform, we reduce the incentive for pupils to ask parents for the latest (and most expensive) items of fashion. As a result, costs are kept as low as possible and no child can be seen to be poorer or wealthier than any other.

We are proud of the multi-cultural and inclusive nature of Crown Hills and celebrate our cultural diversity.

We ensure that our uniform respects religious and cultural dress.

The College principles on uniform

- School uniform is intended to be smart, comfortable and free from fashion extremes
- School uniform is also worn to help identification and to create a more secure establishment
- The Principal's/Governors' decision on suitable items will be final
- The College will adopt a rigorous set of procedures and sanctions to maintain standards of school uniform and will enforce these standards consistently
- The College will ensure that uniform items are of good quality and value
- If students fail to comply with uniform policy, there will be sanctions imposed. Initially, you will be contacted via the my child at school app. If there is persistent defiance and non-compliance, then the sanctions will be increased.
- In certain cases, to allow student to engage with learning, temporary uniform may be loaned. However, this is not a long term, permanent solution and it is the parent's

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responsibility to ensure their child has the correct uniform. We recommend that your child has adequate room in their clothing for growth and has spare items of clothing if you know they are likely to damage their items of clothing easily.

However, this list is not exhaustive and the College's decision on what is/is not acceptable is final. If parents are unsure as to whether a particular style will be accepted, they must send a picture of the shoe to the School before purchasing.

One outdoor coat - must be plain and reasonably waterproof. No decoration or large logos are permitted. Leather, denim jackets and 'fashion coats' are not allowed. (Coloured sweaters and 'hoodies' are NOT outdoor coats.)

Outdoor coats, scarves, hats and gloves, hoods must not be worn in the college building or in the canteen.

Students must wear their identity badge visibly on a lanyard around their neck at all times unless directed by a member of staff. The ID must not be defaced

On health and safety grounds, all staff and students must be identifiable at all times.

	Students must have the basic equipment for learning. i.e. Pens, pencils, ruler,

	Students should have their planner with them throughout the day as well as

PE Kit	Students should enter and leave the College in full uniform. PE and Dance kit		
	is for lesson time only and should be carried in a bag.

face consequences to help meet our expectations.

college is known. If you have difficulty affording uniform at any time, please see the Principal in			
confidence, as we may be able to help. We also occasionally have preloved uniform items that the			
school can support families with, although this stock varies throughout the year.
