What is an Apprenticeship?

• TRAINING - apprentices spend at least 20% of their working hours completing classroom-based learning with a college, university or training provider which leads to a nationally recognised QUALIFICATION.

• An apprenticeship is a PAID job, with full employee benefits.

- 1. Active and hands-on
- 2. Alternative to academic pathway
- 3. Early experience and exposure to the real world
- 4. Clear and bespoke development plan



What is a T-Level?

- COLLEGE students spend at least 80% of their hours completing classroom-based learning with a college, which leads to a nationally recognised QUALIFICATION.
- WORK students spend 20% of their time in work to gain experience while learning.

- 1. Academic with a practical focus
- 2. Very new started in 2021
- 3. Early exposure to the real world
- 4. Courses developed by Industry focussed on specific skills needed in those job areas

Technical Vs Academic

- 1. Pay
- 2. Experience in real job
- 3. Qualification while earning
- 4. Experience roles before spending years studying
- 5. Early start on your career ladder
- 6. Same level qualification as academic, but also have experience


- 1. University/campus experience
- 2. In-depth focus on subject of study

- 1. Competitive graduate job market
- 2. Unlikely to have much experience of work
- 3. Will have incurred costs



Compare Qualification Levels

Apprenticeships are available across a number of different levels of role: from apprenticeships for new starters to higher and degree apprenticeships. An apprenticeship is on-the-job training available to those aged 16 and over. Apprenticeships must last for at least 12 months, typically lasting between 12 to 18 months.




